Application instructions

Thoroughly clean and prepare site. Prep well beyond the entire site according to facility protocol to ensure adherence. Allow it to dry completely (for at least 30 seconds). Note: If the prep doesn't dry completely, the integrity and security may be compromised. A skin protectant may be used according to preference or protocol. Allow the area to dry completely.


Slide WingGuard under the catheter hub and centre the hub wings over WingGuard.

Holding the catheter in place, pull the tab out from the centre to create an opening in the slit. Insert the first catheter wing into the slit.

Repeat on the other side.

Remove the liner one side at a time and adhere WingGuard to the skin.

Apply your preferred dressing over the site as usual.



Removal instructions (not shown)

Remove the dressing.

Optional: Apply a sterile tape strip to catheter tubing to help stabilise the catheter prior to removing WingGuard.

While stabilising the catheter, pull the WingGuard tab out from the centre to create an opening in the slit to release the catheter hub wings from the device.

Peel WingGuard slowly off the skin, away from the exit site.



To properly dress the site, a dressing should cover the catheter exit site.

'Improved adhesive products and securement devices ... are essential to provide increased catheter stability. Such products ... may reduce catheter dislodgement and the necessity of reinsertion with its associated needle stick risk'.
